

# **MOBILE PHONES – STUDENT USE**



#### Help for non-English speakers

#### **PURPOSE**

To explain to our school community the Department's and Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility's policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones and other personal mobile devices such as smart watches during school hours.

#### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students at Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility and,
- 2. Students' personal mobile phones other personal mobile devices such as smart watches brought onto school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

# **DEFINITIONS**

**A mobile phone** is a telephone with access to a cellular (telecommunication) system, with or without a physical connection to a network. For the purpose of this policy, "mobile phone" refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone such as smart watches.

## **POLICY**

Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility:

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

# Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

# Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the Personal Property Policy on the school's website.

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility students are required to hand their phones to their classroom teacher who will store them in a locked drawer or cupboard.

#### **Enforcement**

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing student engagement policies.

- Student Wellbeing and Engagement
- Bullying Prevention

At Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility inappropriate use of mobile phones is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms

# **Exceptions**

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
  - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
  - o Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones Student Use Policy</u>.

The two categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's <u>Mobile Phones — Student Use</u> <u>Policy</u> are:

#### 1. Learning-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
For specific learning activities (class-based	Unit of work, learning sequence
exception)	

For students for whom a reasonable adjustment to	Individual Learning Plan
a learning program is needed because of a disability	
or learning difficulty	

# 2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
Students with a health condition	Student Health Support Plan

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

## Camps, excursions and extracurricular activities

Eastwood Primary School and Deaf Facility will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can or cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones, wearable devices and iPads.

#### **Exclusions**

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-School-Hours Care (OSHC)
- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school

#### COMMUNICATION

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Available publicly on our school's website
- Included in staff induction processes and staff training
- Included in staff handbook/manual
- Discussed at annual staff briefings/meetings
- Discussed at parent information nights/sessions
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request
